Before the Final Blessing, those Religious who had celebrated their 50th, 60th 70th and 80th Religious Profession were acknowledged.

Following the Mass, everyone was invited to enjoy the delicious morning tea where there was much chatter and sharing among the various Religious Congregations. The Oak Jubilarians were then invited to cut the cake and were honoured. Everyone present experienced joy and happiness in coming together as one family.
